Sickness Absence

We have a "48 hour" rule for sickness and diarrhoea, as per guidance from the School Nurse Team. We ask parents to keep their children away from school for 48hours from the last time they were sick or had a tummy upset. This guidance is simply to keep your child as healthy as possible and so we can try to keep our school germs and bugs to a minimum.

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school and can be prosecuted if they fail to ensure their child's attendance at school or provide an alternative education. If a parent or carer fails to secure their child's regular attendance at school, they are committing a criminal offence. A Fixed Penalty Notice, which includes a fine, may be issued in cases of 'Unauthorised Absence'. Please see our website "policies" page for further Attendance information. Holiday requests in term time will not be authorised for any Year 6 children, nor for Year 1 or Year 2 in May and June due to statutory testing.

Hello and welcome to both new and existing St Peter's families.

We are looking forward to the Reception children being in the building from 11th September and to seeing the Nursery children from 17th September. Mr Tyler and his team have done such a good job to ensure the school is looking clean and tidy, and yet again, teaching and support staff have been in during the holidays preparing for the new term by putting up displays and labelling books and drawers. We are looking forward to working with you all this year again and to getting to know our new children and their families.

We try to keep parents informed of what is going on mainly through our school website, but will also direct you to important events and information through letters and text messages too. This Newsletter contains a great deal of important information, some of which is also on our website, but we would also like to draw your attention to it here.

School Times

The gates on both sites open at 8.35am and a member of Senior Management (Head/Deputy/SENDCO) will be there to welcome children and families at each of the school entrances.

Reception, Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 teachers greet parents and children at the door from 8.35am

Years 4, 5 and 6 class teachers meet their children and parents in the Brambledean playground from 8.35am.

At 8.40am Years 4, 5 and 6 children will be lined up and taken to their classrooms by their teachers. The Brambledean Road gate is locked at 8.45am. Year 3 children must also be in the building at this time. KS2 children arriving after 8.45am must go to the main entrance and sign the Late Book.

The Reception and KS1 entrance doors will be closed at 8.50am. Children arriving after this time MUST go to the main entrance and sign the Late Book.

The doors are open to Nursery children at 8.55am and then again at 12.00pm midday on a Wednesday.

The St Peter's Road gates are re-opened at 2.50pm for collection and the Brambledean Road gates at 3.00pm. Children are handed over individually to parents/carers by the teacher at the end of the day, or, in KS1, assisted by the TA or Nursery Nurse if there is a Supply teacher covering. Messages are left with the teachers in the morning if children are to be collected by a different person.

Parent Helpers

We are always very keen to have parents, carers and grandparents helping out in school so if you can spare some time each week please get in touch with your child's teacher. This applies to our Junior aged classes, too! For our new Reception children we encourage parents to let the children settle into the school routines for the first half term before volunteering in class.

Playground Supervision

We like to see the children making use of the playgrounds before and after school, but please remember to always keep your eye on your child as we have had a few incidents in the playgrounds outside of school hours, which have resulted in injuries and dangerous situations. Please also DO NOT use our equipment laid out in the playground before school or get equipment out after school. We ask parents to vacate the playground by 3.30pm.

World Book Day

Each year we celebrate <u>World Book Day</u> and we get to see a wonderful array of imaginative and colourful character costumes. If you have any costumes that are still in condition but that your child has outgrown, then we would appreciate if you could donate them to the school, so they can be reused. *Although World Book Day is not until 7th March, we would appreciate any costumes being brought into school before then.*

Bookbags/rucksacks

Please be reminded that children in the infant school (Nursery to Year 2) are not to use rucksacks as bags due to our limited cloakroom space. Bookbags for infant pupils are available from the school office at $\pounds 4.00$ each. Children in year 3 upwards may have a rucksack and these are available at £9.50 each.

PΕ

All children require a full PE kit, in a named bag, to be left in school. Everything in your child's PE kit should be clearly named. PE kits consist of a white T-shirt (plain or with the school logo), black or navy shorts/skorts/leggings and white/black/navy socks. KS1 and Early Years children also require a pair of trainers or plimsolls. KS2 children should have a pair of trainers for PE as these offer greater support. Children in KS2 who have their ears pierced need to either take their earrings out for PE or put tape over their earrings. In KS1 and Early Years we would prefer that children who have their ears pierced take their earrings out at home on the days that they have PE.

Please take your child's PE kit home to wash on a Friday/at the end of term or at the end of any week when you deem it necessary, but please make sure to return it on Monday ready for the next week.

E-safety

We would like to remind parents that the minimum age to open an account on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Pinterest, Tumblr, Kik, and Snapchat is 13. YouTube requires account holders to be 18, but a 13-year-old can sign up with a parent's permission.

As of May 2018, WhatsApp's minimum age of use is 16 years old if you live in the European Union, or a country that has adopted the GDPR, as the UK has. It was previously 13 and WhatsApp has not yet said what will happen to users between 13 and 16 who already held accounts under the old terms and conditions.

Please see below information to help you with their application process:Make an on-line application to Brighton and Hove City Council either through their website www.brighton-hove.gov.uk or by phoning them on 01273 293653 for a paper copy. This needs to be completed by 31st October 2018 and returned to Brighton and Hove City Council. If the student lives outside of Brighton and Hove you must make your application through your Local Authority and it will be forwarded to Brighton and Hove City Council.

Complete our Supplementary Information Form (SIF) which can be downloaded from our website www.cncs.co.uk under our admissions page the document is Supplementary Information Form (2019/20). (A pager copy can be collected from the school).

If you are expressing a preference for a place for your child at this school and wish to apply in connection with one of the faith criteria, you should complete this Supplementary Information Form (SIF)

- (SIF), if you do not complete the SIF and return it to the school with all supporting documents by the dosing date, your child may not be placed in the appropriate faith criterion. This is likely to affect your child's chance of being offered a place.

 For a Year 7 Admission in the normal admissions round for the Year 2019 /20, the completed SIF,
- together with all supporting documents, should be returned to the school by 31th Cotober 2018. If you are applying to more than one Catholic school, you will need to fill out a separate SIF for each school.
- You must also complete the local authority Common Application Form (CAF). The SIF is not valid without the CAF.
 We also require evidence of Baptism or Dedication (where applicable).

School Uniform

In our Newsletter dated 15th June 2018 we asked that parents should pay careful attention to what constituted appropriate school uniform, and in particular, to what the expectation was for suitable footwear.

School Shoes Guidance for Academic Year 2018/19

We would like to draw the attention of parents/guardians to the importance of buying the correct school footwear for pupils. School shoes must be plain black leather / leather look, and either laced, with a strap or slipon shoes.

For reasons of Health and Safety, maximum heel height is 2cms, measured on the outside of the heel. *Trainers/sports branded shoes are not permitted.*

Please note: the following do not conform to school regulations and must not be purchased to be worn with school uniform:

• platform or wedge shoes • canvas or other textile shoes • Vans, Converse and similar style shoes
We notified parents in plenty of time (June) so that appropriate new shoes were bought for the new school year.

We would also like to remind parents that leggings are not part of our school uniform. Children may wear grey or black tights or socks with their dresses or skirts, or grey or black trousers.

We recommend that children with long hair should keep it tied back and if hairbands are worn they should only be in the school colours of turquoise, black or white

We do not allow jewellery other than small earrings and watches, and do not permit the wearing of makeup or nail varnish.

We would appreciate your co-operation in ensuring that your child is wearing the correct school uniform; it is unfair on those children who are following the rules to have others in their class who do not. If there is any medical or financial reason why your child is not wearing the correct school uniform then please come and speak to us.

FREE swimming!



Unsightly, smelly, unhealthy, antisocial and illegal

Dog mess can:

- > Cause distress to young children, who fall or step in it
- Carry a parasite causing a disease that can lead to blindness
- > Spread Parvo, a potentially fatal canine disease
- Create problems for wheelchair and mobility aid users, cyclists and sports players.

So please pay attention to what your dog is up to; clear any mess into bags and put into a bin!

Do NOT allow your dog to enter the playground.

The Dog Fouling Act 2016 places responsibility on the person in charge of the dog, It's not an excuse to say that you are not aware of the fouling, you can still be fined even if you are not the dog's owner!
