ATTENDANCE

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school and can be prosecuted if they fail to ensure their child's regular attendance at school or provide alternative education, as this is a criminal offence. A Fixed Penalty Notice, including a fine, may be issued for unauthorised absences. Leave of absence requests in term time will not be authorised for Year 6 children, nor for Year 1 or Year 2 in May or June due to statutory testing.

SICKNESS ABSENCE

We have a "48 hour" rule for sickness and diarrhoea, as per guidance from the School Nurse Team. Please keep your child away from school for 48 hours from the last time they were sick or had a tummy upset. This guidance is simply to keep your child as healthy as possible and to keep our school germs to a minimum.

Behaviour

At the beginning of every school year teachers set out or remind children about the expectations of behaviour both in and out of the classroom. The school rule of treating others the way you want to be treated should be reflected in the way children behave towards each other and towards all adults in the school. This means that they are not rude or disrespectful to each other or to adults. It means they don't talk over another person or talk whilst another person is talking to them. It means we expect them to speak politely to others and not answer back rudely. There is an expectation that parents will support this at home by teaching them good manners and to be respectful to adults. Adults in school are reminding children particularly in the juniors of these expectations and sanctioning the rude or disrespectful behaviour through loss of playtime. We also need to remind a very small number of parents that we also have those expectations of polite behaviour towards school staff as occasionally there have been adults who have been loud and aggressive on school premises or spoken rudely to office staff in particular.

Parent Helpers

We are always very keen to have parents, carers and grandparents helping out in school so if you can spare some time each week please get in touch with your child's teacher. This applies to our Junior aged classes, too! For our new Reception children we encourage parents to let the children settle into the school routines for the first half term before volunteering in class.

E-Safety

We need to remind parents that the minimum age to open an account on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Pinterest, Tumblr, Kik and Snapchat is 13. YouTube requires account holders to be 18 but a 13 year old can sign up with their parent's permission. Since May 2018 WhatsApp's minimum age use is 16 years old if you live in the UK.

Most parents are aware of the danger from strangers on these websites but in school we are increasingly having to deal with friendship issues arising from the use of these social media platforms, and most recently had to deal with an exceptionally unpleasant incident where two children set up an offensive Instagram account about a member of staff. Parents need to monitor their children's access to the internet very closely as this type of activity is likely to result in exclusion for the children involved.

Meerkats

From Tuesday 1 October - Sunday 1 December 2019, nine meerkats will be let loose and hiding around the streets of central Brighton. Are you ready to take up the challenge and try to find them?

This mini-adventure is for young children and their families, but anyone can take part, whatever your age.
